Hence, this novel shows all the features characteristic of postmodernist historiographic metafiction. That is to say, like other historiographic metafictions, England, England is both intensely self-reflexive and yet paradoxically also lays claim to historical events and personages. What is more, Barnes novel also reflects the feature which has been the major focus of attention in most of the critical work on postmodernism, i. e. a self-conscious assessment of the status and...
